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#### **Executive Summary**

The Angel National Conference at Kelantan, hosted by UMK in collaboration with UTHM was a resounding success, providing a valuable forum for exchanging ideas and fostering collaborations aimed at promoting green entrepreneurship and sustainability. The event highlighted the critical role of innovative solutions like BSFL in managing food waste and the importance of green leadership in driving systemic change towards environmental sustainability. Attendees left with renewed inspiration and actionable insights to implement sustainable practices in their respective fields, paving the way for a greener and more sustainable future.

The ANGEL NICE 2024 in Jakarta, Indonesia was attended by three different stakeholders, from government/policymakers to national officers such as the Ministry of Cooperatives and Small Medium Enterprises, Ministry of Higher Education Research and Technology and National Research & Innovation Agency, and regional officers. High-ranking government officials who attended were very impressed with the enthusiasm of the participants and the atmosphere of enthusiasm for innovation and developing technology, including those from the disability community who attended this event. The Indonesia ANGEL National Conference was hosted by UII and UGM in Jakarta.

The National Conference in Hanoi, Vietnam attracted both participants onsite and online (6 participants and speakers). Stakeholders were not only top leaders of universities and academic staff, but also mentors and mentees, students, etc. The organizing committee also invited representatives from the Ministry of Science and Technology of Vietnam, who gave not only the keynote speech about the guidelines and key orientation for innovation and green development in Vietnam. The event was also a good chance to cherish Green Awards for Green Entrepreneurship and Leadership in 2023 for excellent teams of the two universities (partners in ANGEL Project) and ANGEL's experiences. This chapter was successfully hosted by HUMG and CTU.

SKU hosted the national conference in Laos to share project outcomes and lessons learned, alongside eith Champasak University (CU). The event involved government agencies, local businesses, and other stakeholders, aiming to foster future cooperation. Additionally, other Erasmus projects from SKU and CU exhibited their experiences. # 5. <u>Short description of the event</u> (including the expected local/regional officers, investors and businesses):

#### i.Stakeholders and their interests:

The ANGEL National Conference attracted diverse stakeholders, each with distinct interests centered on promoting cultural diversity and business sustainability. Shariah-compliant fintech platforms were interested in gaining insights into green entrepreneurship, green finance basics, and marketing strategies for green businesses, ensuring their investment opportunities aligned with ethical and sustainable principles. #### 4. Overview of the event:

The ANGEL National Conference & Exhibition (ANGEL NICE) 2024 was attended by academics and researchers from various universities interested in innovation and sustainability, green business practitioners, entrepreneurs, and disability community leaders looking to develop their businesses within the framework of green entrepreneurship, as well as government representatives and policymakers who play a role in creating supportive regulations. Additionally, students and aspiring green entrepreneurs are invited to gain insights and inspiration, along with local community members and vulnerable groups who want to engage in the green entrepreneurship ecosystem to enhance inclusion and social impact

The national conference and exhibition also aim to connect green entrepreneurship leaders from various sectors to share experiences and knowledge and build effective collaborations. Through various discussion sessions and presentations featuring experts from various fields, ANGEL NICE 2024 is expected to become a catalyst for the development of a resilient and sustainable green entrepreneurship ecosystem. This conference not only provides new knowledge but also encourages the creation of tangible collaborations with a positive impact on the broader community.

5. <u>Short description of the event</u> (including the expected local/regional officers, investors, and businesses):

The purpose of the ANGEL National Conference & Exhibition 2024 is to bring together all stakeholders at the national level to share practical knowledge and ideas on promoting university-led entrepreneurship. Special emphasis will be placed on developing market-university and community-university synergies and engaging policymakers.





The agenda for ANGEL NICE 2024 was attended by three different stakeholders, from government/policymakers to national officers such as the Ministry of Cooperatives and Small Medium Enterprises, Ministry of Higher Education Research and Technology and National Research & Innovation Agency, and regional officers. High-ranking government officials who attended were very impressed with the enthusiasm of the participants and the atmosphere of enthusiasm for innovation and developing technology, including those from the disability community who attended this event. The speaker also thanked the organizers, through this event the strategic efforts on a national scale in establishing penta helix collaboration, which until now were still felt to be egocentric, were finally realized.

Business owners and investors who attended were also impressed by the government speakers' presentations regarding the various policies presented and various for entrepreneurship development and innovation funding. This is a rare opportunity, and it is felt that it needs to be followed up immediately to synergize and collaborate with academic partners in increasing entrepreneurial innovation and impact on society.

The presentation from the disability community (Drs. Setya Adi Purwanto) also attracted very positive attention from the audience, where he, who has a visual impairment, is a disability community leader who is very enthusiastic about encouraging other people with disabilities to have entrepreneurial enthusiasm and skills. This inspiration from him then became an encouragement for business people who do not have disabilities, so that they become more resilient in developing their businesses.

  - i. Stakeholders and their interests: The ANGEL National Conference & Exhibition 2024 brought together a vibrant mix of stakeholders, each with a keen interest in green entrepreneurship. Among the attendees were business leaders, industry partners, academics, government, innovators, and local community members. Business and industry participants were particularly interested in exploring new green technologies and sustainable business models that they could incorporate into their operations. Academics and researchers



were eager to find opportunities for collaboration and to see how cuttingedge scientific advancements could be applied in practical, real-world situations.

Government officials and policymakers attended to gain insights into the regulatory frameworks and support systems needed to foster green entrepreneurship. Innovators and entrepreneurs were excited to showcase their solutions, receive valuable feedback and potentially secure investment or partnerships. This diverse mix of interests made the event a dynamic platform for discussing and promoting a sustainable entrepreneurial ecosystem

#### ii. Stakeholders and their satisfaction:

Feedback from the participants reflected a high level of satisfaction with the event. Many praised the meticulous preparation and organization, noting that the registration process was smooth, the agenda was wellplanned, and the venue arrangement was top-notch. The relevance and depth of the topics covered were highly appreciated, as they closely aligned with the attendees' interests and professional needs. The diverse speaker panel, featuring experts from various fields, was particularly highlighted as a significant strength of the conference.

Attendees also valued the networking opportunities provided. The exhibition allowed them to engage directly with innovators and entrepreneurs, fostering connections that could lead to future collaborations. The session's interactive nature, including Q&A segments and panel discussion, was well received as it encouraged active participation and the exchange of ideas and knowledge.

#### Stakeholders and their recommendations: iii.

Participants had several recommendations for future events. A common suggestion was to include more hands-on workshops and interactive sessions. These would enable stakeholders to gain practical skills and knowledge relevant to their specific context. Another recommendation was to expand outreach efforts to involve a more diverse range of stakeholders, particularly from underrepresented regions or sectors.

Additionally, stakeholders suggested that future events should feature more case studies and success stories from green entrepreneurs. These real-world examples could provide valuable insight and inspiration.

#### Any issues and challenges: iv.

Despite the overall success of the event, the participants noted some challenges. One issue was the limited time allocated for some sessions,





which restricted the depth of discussion and interaction. Some attendees felt that certain topics warranted more detailed exploration and suggested allocating more time for these in future events. There were also logistical challenges, such as technical issues with presentations and delays in session timings, highlighting the need for stronger technical support and better time management.




